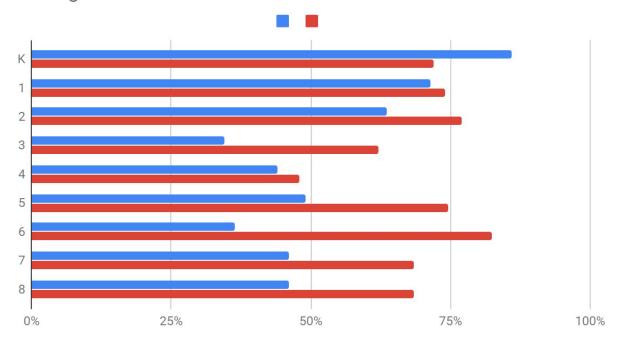

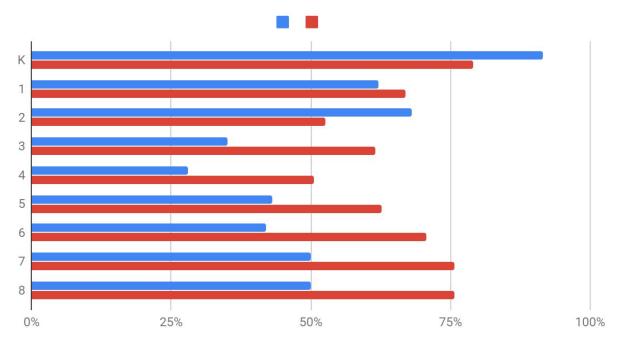
# Reading Growth 2018 vs 2019
